To whom it may concern,

I am writing to share some of the successes we have experienced since re-introducing the Cool Schools Mediator Programme back into our kura.

Early in 2023, as Whānau Leader of our senior school, I attended the Cool Schools Coordinator's workshop led by Christina Barruel. I had experienced working in another school with student mediators in action and already knew how wonderfully the programme worked.

Soon after the workshop, I began recruiting a team of 25 very keen Year 6 students. They had to apply for a position, explaining why they would be a valuable part of the team. I ran our own 2 day comprehensive training for the children, using the resources and framework I had learnt during my own training. Following this, I ran a staff training to ensure we were all on the same page. Some of the teachers then included valuable life-lessons about active listening, making I-statements and recognising and articulating feelings into their classroom programmes. Throughout the year, the Student Mediators and I met regularly to adjust the roster, discuss what was going well or what was challenging, to organise and practise assembly items or to upskill.

The children did such an amazing job. They took their role very seriously and remained completely committed for the entirety of the year. Our playgrounds became a noticeably calmer place, where duty teachers often felt redundant and the office staff were able to use their time in other ways. Younger tamariki loved being helped by students and were always very proud when they managed to resolve a minor conflict without any help from a teacher. They learnt to trust their tuakana. Around mid-year we sought out some feedback from our school community. Here are some of the comments we received;

"The mediators do such an amazing job. Before (they were out in the playground), we would have lots of students coming into the office and we would be very very busy, but you guys have made our lives so much easier. They have stopped coming into the office for all the little reasons, as the mediators are helping them outside and we are so very grateful for all the fabulous work you do!" Shelley- Office staff

"I like how mediators help us solve problems" Sienna- age 5

"Mediators help people when they are upset and make sure they can find a solution for the problem." Irie-May-age 8

"The mediators are such good listeners, they have really taken on board everything they learnt in their training, they are very responsible and mature in the way they go about guiding tamariki through the mediation process. You are all such great role models." Lance- Teacher

"The mediators help with all the small issues, so you don't need to get a teacher." Juan-age 8

"The mediators have been fantastic, because they have taken the pressure off the teachers. It's really lovely to see children helping other children to solve those problems and I think it's enabled children to work together to help make our school a better place during playtimes."

"Mediators make friends be happy again" Hanah- age 5

As well as the success we've seen in the playground, we observed some real personal growth in our mediators. They became amazingly empathetic listeners and were able to quickly build rapport with people they hardly knew, and they gained such satisfaction in using the mediation process to help others. We saw the quieter children find their voice and grow immensely in confidence, while some of the more rebellious children corrected their path and became amazing role models, who we could really depend on. (They wanted to ensure they could remain part of the team!)

Late last year, when it was time to recruit a new team for 2024, we had huge interest. We also had 2 more staff join the team after seeing this programme's value. They participated in the November workshop and now are helping facilitate and support our mediators. Together, we repeated the 2 day comprehensive student training and now we are all very grateful to have another highly committed team of 33 mediators working hard to ensure our playgrounds are a peaceful, happy and safe place for our tamariki.
